- 4 **Officers:** The Chairman, Mrs Jennifer Andrew, Secretary Miss Sheila Patchett and Treasurer Mrs Helen Simpson agreed to stand for a further year were proposed by F Atkinson, seconded by J Atkinson. It was pointed out that younger people would be required to take office in future years, otherwise the organisation could fail.

- 6 **Treasurers Report:** The accounts were presented. The Show had gone ahead in a modified form incurring expenses, but with no income from entry fees or auction. The accounts were proposed by L Greenwood and seconded by Z Greenwood. John Andrew was thanked for auditing the accounts
  - a. Discussion took place on whether Santander was now charging for group accounts. The Treasurer would check and if necessary find a fee free option.
  - b. It was agreed that the Show day door entry fee and the refreshment prices would remain at £1.00.
  - c. The class entry fees would rise to 25p, but there would be no increase in the prize money.
  - d. Currently there were 3 signatories for the bank account, two being required for each cheque. The Treasurer had no means of paying for services other than cheque. It was agreed that she would register for online banking, with one other person overseeing the account. Votes for 10, against 2, abstentions 2.
  - e. Members would be able to pay their subscriptions and entry fees online if they wished and the details would be on the membership card.

Printing of the maps which act as entry tickets would be the main expense. The meeting agreed to endorse the idea and thanked her for the suggestion.
